Delivering the NHS Covid-19 vaccination

The latest figures showing 34.5 % of people in North Herefordshire have now received a vaccine.

A fourth Covid-19 Vaccination Centre is opening this week in Herefordshire and Worcestershire as the programme continues to make excellent progress.

In the latest phase of our rollout and in line with JCVI guidance, 65 to 69 year olds and adult carers have now been invited to receive their first vaccinations, with people aged 64 also set to be called forward later this week. GPs have also been offering jabs to their most clinically vulnerable patients.

Figures published last week by NHS England show that nearly 260,000 first vaccinations have now been administered across Herefordshire and Worcestershire. This means that more than 40% of our population (those aged over 16) have now had their first dose and have some protection against the virus, including nearly everyone aged over 70 and already over 80% of people aged between 65 and 69.



May I remind everyone to be vigilant about scams including those apparently involving vaccines – the NHS will never charge you for a vaccine and will only visit your home if you are totally house bound. If you are concerned about your health for other reasons please contact your GP.

New campaign encourages the nation to keep going and stay at home

The Government has, (on 25 February), launched a new national campaign encouraging people to keep going and stay at home. The new advertising reminds people everything they're doing is helping stop the spread of the virus.

The campaign, aired for the first time yesterday on ITV, will run across TV, radio, out-of-home advertising and on social media, reminding people that everything they've done – working from home, washing their hands, wearing a mask, maintaining social distancing and video calling – is helping stop the spread of coronavirus and new variants.

Herefordshire Full Council meeting update

Last month the council held two separate meetings to debate the Hereford City Transport package and the setting of the 2021/22 budget. I attended the full council's extraordinary meeting on 2nd February, which was called to determine if we go ahead with the bypass and the southern link road.

We were all advised by the officer that the outcome of this meeting should not be predetermined, that we should listen to the arguments and then make a judgment before we vote. However, after listening to members of the administration, it became clear that they had already made up their minds and in my opinion. Indeed one of the cabinet members announced on National TV that the road had been stopped days before the councillors made their decision in the Council Chamber in Hereford. Additionally, the administration have spent the last two years and four hundred and eighty three thousand pounds of your money conducting reviews trying to find a reason to cancel the bypass and the southern link road.

This administration seems to have the notion that all road building is evil. They have turned away over 200 million pounds of investment in Hereford's infrastructure and at the same time have wasted money on projects like buying a defunct shopping centre and getting us all onto electric buses and bicycles. Notwithstanding, their strategy does nothing to ease the congestion in Hereford along the A49, continues the 46,000 daily traffic flows over Greyfriars Bridge with the polluted air residents breathe as they walk or ride their bikes around town.

Therefore, the bypass and the Southern Link roads are now dead for this administration. In addition, some councillors are still espousing the need for an Eastern river crossing towards Tupsley. Interesting as heavy goods vehicles will need to try to get back on the A49 for their journey north after avoiding the city centre.

I supported the package including the green measures for the city, and the conservative amendment to continue the southern link road. The result has been well documented and been the subject of a Hereford Times investigation into how councillors voted, which has produced some interesting points with a Councillor Jenny Bartlett, Green Party member and in the administration is reported as saying "she had no problem with people knowing how she voted" but felt a story telling the public how Councillors voted was "populist, divisiveness" and a "disingenuous way of pretending to support democracy"!! Its openness, accountability and transparency that is at the heart of good government.

Budget and council tax

I supported a Conservative amendment on the budget to increase the council tax to only 3.99% and to use the New Homes Bonus to support those in Herefordshire who may be struggling. The result will be an increase in council tax from Herefordshire Council of 4.99%.

One of the big underlying problems Herefordshire faces is it's overspend in vulnerable children services (estimate £5 million overspend). Additionally, many children with very complex needs require significant packages of support which extend all their adult lives and I am afraid is a subject that is not getting properly addressed.

Support for people facing financial hardship.

At council, councillors have agreed to increase the discounts for those eligible for council tax relief during the next financial year.

More than 11,000 council taxpayers in the county currently receive a reduction and more than 6,000 of these claims come from working age householders. There is an expectation that this will increase during the next financial year due to the economic impact of the coronavirus pandemic and possibly the effects of the 4.99% council tax increase.

Council Tax funds around 29% of the council's budget. A 4.99% total increase to Council Tax has been agreed following unsuccessful amendments being proposed at council meeting. This is an equivalent rise of £1.51 a week for a Band D property. The increase is made from a 3% increase to the 'adult social care precept' and 1.99% increase to 'core Council Tax'. In total this will provide £3.2m towards the cost of council services.

Residents on a low income may be eligible for help to pay their bill through the Council Tax Reduction scheme. Some residents will continue to pay no Council Tax at all, such as young adults who have left care and, with effect from 2021, also all the council's Foster Carer families.

Flooding

At last week's council budget meeting the Conservative group proposed a further amendment that the council should set aside the money from the New Homes Bonus fund to set aside £341,000 for parish councils to bid for, to alleviate and prevent flooding in their areas on highway drainage as a grant scheme. I supported this further amendment motion; but this amendment was lost.

The New Homes Bonus is a government incentive that rewards councils for the number homes built in their area.

Councillor Shaw said some of the funding could be used to help parishes in dealing with flooding. He said “This particular fund will not be panacea but ought to be a cost-effective way of enabling parishes help themselves to attend to seeing to roads and take away some of the spots where flooding is a pernicious, persistent and perennial problem every winter.”

Fly Tipping and Household Recycling Stations

Councils in England dealt with more than 976,000 fly-tipping cases in the year up to the start of the coronavirus pandemic, up two per cent on the 950,000 incidents in 2018/19, figures show. The number of court fines issued for fly-tipping increased by a third in the last year, from 2,056 to 2,671.

The incidences of fly tipping in Herefordshire has also increased. It is reported in the Hereford Times that fly-tipped waste is discovered in Herefordshire twice a day on average, figures reveal.

Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs data shows 685 fly-tipping incidents were reported to Herefordshire Council in 2019-20 – 193 more than the previous year.

The Local Government Association warned that the offence costs taxpayers almost £50 million a year to clear up. Dumped waste was found on Herefordshire's roads and pavements 104 times accounting for 15% of incidents while 42 discoveries were made on footpaths and bridleways (6%). Fly-tipped rubbish can include household waste, white goods and construction waste.

Across Herefordshire, small van loads of waste were dumped illegally on 129 occasions – 19% of all reports. There were also five incidents which required multiple loads to clear.

The administration does not rule out cutting the opening hours across the county's tips to help save £200,000 next year; looking to make savings in the way it operates the household waste sites by increasing some of its fees and changing the way they are run.

2021 marks the start of a four-year transition period during which BPS payments will be phased out in the lead up to Environmental Land Management. The scheme is being simplified with new offers to apply for, and additional penalties have been removed (although reductions can still occur where things can't be put right). There will be advice and support to help you enhance the environment as part of a sustainable business.

Extra Cash to Fix Potholes

Government has announced £500 million for local authorities to fix 10 million potholes across England – helping councils ensure that our roads are kept up to standard and that potholes that blight road users are being dealt with promptly.

Herefordshire will receive a further £6.3 million from this funding, and our residents will know that potholes are not only nuisance, but they can be a danger to drivers and cyclists, as well as causing damage to thousands of vehicles every year.

With the average pothole costing £50 to fill in, the funding will ensure the equivalent of 10 million potholes can be filled and fixed. This funding will ensure that councils can ensure that local roads are both safer and easier to drive and cycle on, as well as reducing the risk of damage to vehicles for road users.

Fuel Poverty

Whether a household is in fuel poverty is determined by the interplay of three key factors:

1. the energy efficiency of the property
2. the household income
3. fuel/energy prices

National analysis of fuel poverty data indicates that households in fuel poverty are more likely to occupy large, older houses, and be owner-occupiers and families.

In 2016, there were an estimated 81,800 households in Herefordshire, 13.5% of which were in fuel poverty (11,000); a higher proportion than in England as a whole (11.1%). The majority of households affected by fuel poverty live in rural areas.

In 2019, a report by BRE on behalf of Herefordshire council found that higher concentrations of private sector households in fuel poverty are found in the more rural parts of Herefordshire. There are noticeably lower concentrations around urban areas, particularly around the outskirts of Hereford. The highest concentrations of fuel poverty (Low Income High Costs definition) in private housing stock are found in the wards of Birch, **Old Gore** and Golden Valley South.

Census 2021

The census, run by the Office for National Statistics, is a once-in-a-decade survey that gives us the most accurate estimate of all the people and households in England and Wales. The 2021 census takes place in March and among new questions is one asking people whether they have served in the Armed Forces; for the first time, people will be able to say if they are a veteran of the Armed Forces.

As chairman of the Armed Forces Covenant Partnership this knowledge will give us a better understanding of the numbers, locations and age ranges of the nation's veterans and will enable the Government, NHS and service charities to target resources and expertise where they are needed most.

It is important to emphasise that the census is totally anonymous once it reaches the census office as it will then be anonymised, thus taking away any concerns about the census being confidential – it will be.
