Grit/Salt bins

The Lengthsman has on his rounds supplied locations where the need for replacement bin is required. This was discussed at the Parish Council meeting and the purchase of six by the Parish Council was agreed. BBLP have been approached to replace the badly damaged bins but no commitment has yet been made from them.

Celebration

With the Queen Platinum 70th Anniversary next June, the Parish Council are hoping to involve all three Parishes in a commemorative event or an item to commemorate the occasion.

There were three main suggestions made by the Parish Council they are;

- a) A special tree for each Parish.
- b) A commemorative bench for each Parish.
- c) A celebration party with all three Parishes participating

All suggestions have logistical problems which we hope to overcome.

The Parish Council would welcome suggestions from Parishioners We are hopeful that if you have a suggestion that is not one of the above that you will contact the Clerk or a member of the Parish Council with the suggestion, this will enable the preferred choice to be discussed and organised.

Verges and hedgerows.

The clerk attended a zoom meeting with 12 other clerks hosted by HALC where experiences and questions were made and answered. It was generally the opinion of most of the clerks that the verges and hedgerows were a problem that needed extra attention. This raised the question of Parishes leaving the verges uncut during the spring and early summer. Balfour Beatty will as the Parish Council again this year if they wish to have the verges left uncut to allow the wild flowers to blossom. Your views on this would be appreciated via the clerk please.

HALC are looking into approval/support for some kind of Hybrid meeting where Parishioners can join the meeting in person and via audio/video links hopefully improving interaction with parishioners.
