I have concerns about the pace and frequency that these consultations are coming out and the size of them. A survey on village services came out to Parish Councils with originally only a week to reply and was full of inaccuracies; which is of course disappointing!

Thus these consultations are easy to miss or ignore due to their frequency and the size and complexity can be off-putting. However, the consequences on the provisions of homes, development of businesses including farming in the future are significant.

## Waste Collection – new plans



## Emerging new Waste collections service for 2023.

The council is renewing its waste collection service to meet the new government regulations. The emerging plan is a weekly collection service which will require households to store five bins with a three week rotational service.

Week one – a blue bin collection of paper and card products;

Week two – green bin of plastic, cans and glass

Week three- grey bin – general waste

In addition there will be weekly collection of a small food waste bin and seasonal gardening collection fortnightly.

Food and unwashed food packaging is also unfit for recycling. All leftover food needs to go in with general waste. Firm food containers – like the plastic trays ready-meals are packaged in – need to be quickly rinsed before being put out with other recycling items.

Other things not accepted in recycling bins and sacks include:

- Batteries
- Black sacks and other soft plastics
- Drinking glasses (plastic and glass)
- Electronic equipment
- Food
- Garden waste including flowers
- Knives and saucepans
- Nappies

- Textiles and shoes
- Tissues

Black plastic cannot be recycled yet as Envirosort's scanning machines are unable to detect it.

#### Green bin campaign given the green light – Herefordshire Council

#### It is anticipated these changes will not happen till mid-2023.

The new system will be a problem for residents with little room to store the bins and bag collections will continue where existing problems occur. However the aim is boost still further the recycling rates of the county and exceed the government targets.

#### New community grant looks to improve overall wellbeing

Herefordshire Council has announced further funding in response to the overwhelming demand for recent grant schemes. Another round of grants has been launched for community and voluntary groups wanting to provide services and activities to improve overall wellbeing for residents in Herefordshire.

The grants are being funded as part of the council's investment to support economic recovery and improve wellbeing, as the county continues to recover from the impact of Covid-19. The community and personal resilience grant will be administered by Herefordshire Community Foundation and is for grants up to £10,000. It is for projects that will increase the capacity of voluntary and community groups to promote greater personal and community resilience.

The grant scheme is open for applications until Friday 13 May 2022.

#### Local Plan Consultation

As part of the preparation of a new Local Plan for Herefordshire, our existing planning policies need to be re-assessed to determine their effectiveness, consistency with national planning policy and to consider whether they would help to deliver key aspirations of the Herefordshire County Plan.

The Local Plan 2021-2041 Policy Options consultation will run for 6 weeks from **Monday 4 April to 16 May 2022.** It sets out a summary of the context around each of the policy areas and includes range of possible approaches that the new local plan could include.

The policy options within the consultation paper cover general and county-wide matters. Consultation on the policy options for specific places and areas, including the rural settlement hierarchy will take place later this year.

The responses received, together with a number of other studies, will help form the draft Local Plan, so I would urge everybody to get involved and have their say."

If you see a sheep lay on its back like this please go and push her on to her side so she can get on her feet.

This time of year before shearing, the ewes have a large fleece on them and after grazing on the spring grass they become prone to turning on their backs and unable to get themselves up as the grass ferments in their stomach.

## **Report fly tippers**

If you spot someone fly-tipping

- Make a note of any vehicle used, including model, colour and registration number. If it is safe to do so without being seen, take a photograph or video of the activity
- Note the fly tippers' clothes, and distinguishing features. If you can hear the fly tippers, take note of anything which was said along with the speakers' accents
- Make a note of what they dumped, the location, weather conditions and how far away you were at the time;
- You may report fly tipping on an app on the website and available for download.

You can get money off your Council Tax bill, or even pay nothing, in certain circumstances. A discount or exemption depends on your current situation and circumstances, but does not take account of income or savings. If you are on a low income, you may also be able to get help to pay your bill through Council Tax Reduction. We will need to assess your financial and other circumstances to see what help you qualify for.
