Local government elections on 4 May 2023

The last local government elections in Herefordshire were held in 2019. Herefordshire's next scheduled elections will take place on **Thursday 4 May 2023**, where all 53 district wards and 133 parish/town councils will hold elections for new members.

Elections 4 May 2023 – Herefordshire Council

Postal and proxy voting

Many voters today prefer to vote by post. If you will be away on polling day, at work or on holiday, are physically unable or just don't have the time to get to a polling station to vote in person, you can still exercise your democratic right to vote. You may have moved house since the electoral register was drawn up and have not yet joined the register at your new address. For your convenience, you now have the right to vote by post.

New arrangements allow anyone who is on the Register of Electors to apply for a postal vote at any election. However, you must be registered under Individual Electoral Registration to apply to vote by post or proxy. Remember if you can't get to your polling station for whatever reason, you can apply for a postal vote but you must be registered under Individual Electoral Registration first.

Download a <u>postal vote application form</u> and return it to electoral services by post or by hand.

The deadline for the receipt of new postal vote applications or to change or cancel an existing postal applications for all elections is 11 working days prior to polling day. Postal vote ballot papers are normally sent out about a week before the election.

Voter ID required – for first time at election



For the first time residents in Herefordshire will need to show photographic ID to vote at this year's local elections. Residents are being urged to make sure they are ready to vote in May by checking they have an accepted form of ID.

The requirement to show photo ID at the polling station is introduced by the UK Government's Elections Act which was passed last year and

comes into effect for the first time this May. This will affect all electors who vote in person or by proxy, at the next local Council elections on Thursday 4 May 2023 Electors or their proxy must bring a suitable form of photographic ID to their polling station before they are given a ballot paper. If someone doesn't have accepted photo ID, they can apply for a free voter ID document, which is known as a Voter Authority Certificate (VAC).

The electoral commission are running a campaign which we will be supporting to remind people they need to have accepted Photo ID in place in order to vote or they will need to apply for a VAC

However, Parish Councillors: please be advised that this request is ultimately addressing a political event and parish councils are, as a body, non-political. Therefore, it is not permitted for parish councillors or parish clerks acting as parish representatives, in their official capacity, to assist.

Notwithstanding, parish councillors may assist my re-election, if they wish, in a personal capacity. No advertisement or any message relating to my re-election as County Councillor should be displayed on or using any official parish council website, notice board or other official parish council communication means.

Census details for Herefordshire economy

Following last year's ten year census I share with you the figures on population and our Herefordshire economy

- An ageing population has driven a fall in economic activity, with rising numbers of people who are retired 59% of Herefordshire's usual residents aged 16 and over were either working or seeking work in the week before the census 2021, down from 63% in 2011.
- Over a quarter (28%) of usual residents aged 16 years and over were economically inactive because of retirement (compared with 22% nationally).
- 12% of all 16+ year-olds in Herefordshire are self-employed one of the top 10% rates out of all local authorities across England and Wales.
- Herefordshire's working residents were more likely to work in agriculture, forestry and fishing than in England and Wales as a whole (5% compared with 1% the tenth highest rate in the country).

Avian Flu – a serious danger to all bird life



Avian flu affects <u>all birds</u> – domestic, intensive and wildlife. There have now been several outbreaks in Herefordshire and neighbouring counties. Mandatory housing measures for all poultry and captive birds <u>in all areas of England and now Wales.</u>

The housing measures legally require all bird keepers to keep their birds indoors and to follow stringent biosecurity measures to help protect their

flocks from the disease, regardless of type or size. Over the last year, the United Kingdom has faced its largest ever outbreak of avian influenza with hundreds of cases confirmed including in our parishes.

Funding from Government – levelling up Fund

Herefordshire Council has recently received circa £20 million from the Government from the Levelling up Fund. Part has gone towards the cost of a transport hub by the railway station – a long standing ambition of the council for 20 years and one of the reasons the link road was

built between Edgar Street and Aylestone hill. The Transport Hub is currently projected to cost £10 million.

The rest of the funding is to be spend on various cycle ways in the city and to the Rotherwas business park. Unfortunately the case wasn't made for improved investment at Ross Model Farm Business Park, or in Leominster. The fact that a National grant aiming to equalise employment opportunities and improve incomes across England misses the projects to create jobs but is spent on modal shift in the city only reflects the current council's priorities.

Rural cost of Living – Household Survey

Last year I took on the chair of the Rural Services Network which lobbies on behalf of rural communities, rural organisations and local authorities. To support a greater understanding and add evidence to our argument for more funding for rural pressures, we are looking for rural residents to complete a Rural Cost of Living Household Survey. Research shows there are different and extra pressures on rural household budgets compared to urban and we want to explore that. Whatever your income or financial position is we need to demonstrate the extra cost pressures. This will help us engage more effectively with Government departments, MPs and other policy makers.

Childrens Services

The Government's appointed commissioner over Herefordshire Children's services Eleanor Brazil has submitted her report to the Secretary of State, and it will be considered by Claire Coutinho MP (Minister for Children, families and wellbeing). The poor performance over the last couple of years in particularly after extra investment has been a concern, but since her appointment in late summer there has been signs of improvement, and retaining Eleanor Brazil as overseeing commissioner of the council service for an extended period would seem to be a most positive option.

Council Tax

Following consultation over Christmas the council's cabinet are recommending an increase in council tax of 4.99% - 2.99% increase in core council tax plus 2% adult care precept which would raise an additional 2.5 million pounds to support pressures in the social care budget. The increase is equivalent to a band D charge of £1,786.61. In addition Police, Fire service and Parish Council precepts will be added. The finance council meeting will be held on next Friday 10th February 2023.

Hereford City Master Plan

The Council has had a consultation on the Hereford City Master Plan which proposes an eastern crossing of the river Wye but no eastern bypass. The Plan will have a formal public consultation in the summer and puts a greater empathise on active travel of Cycling and walking but my concern is also the link of the rural communities to our main service centre of Hereford.

Last week I 'chaired' an on-site meeting with BBLP, including water drainage experts, Herefordshire Council, Planning Officer and Parish council chairman to discuss the ongoing flooding issue on Church Road and the potential when an approved ten house development is built. The meeting went well and many views were offered and eventually some possibilities were arrived at. The developer has now gone to consider the possibilities and those which he might support.

Upton Bishop/How Caple



I spent some time on A449 last weekend with the police carrying out speed enforcement. The locals perceive this area an issue since the speed limit has been reduced to 40 mph – with vehicles still travelling at over 40 mph in the restricted area. I have raised this matter with the Council's road safety officer and I have requested that some broken white lining is changed to solid white lines. However, due to regulations it is not legally

possible to taken double white lines up to the Ross side 40 mph terminal sign.

How Caple

As you may be aware the Post Office have given notification that they intend to close the How Caple post office, due to the resignation of the postmaster. There is to be an extraordinary parish council meeting held on Tuesday 7th February 2023 at &pm at Brockhampton Village Hall so that other parish councils and residents may have their say about the closure. I have tried to speak with the Post Office (Laura as signed) on three occasions now by email but never returns my email or speaks with me. I shall continue to reach them before Wednesday.
