Parish Council 4-Year Vision and Action Plan:

The Parish Council is currently working on a four-year plan to bring together a vision and associated action plan for the Parish Council for the duration of the term 2023-2027. It will help formalise and plan priorities with a clear and consistent approach, and will include an action plan for projects and ambitions to be carried out over the 4-year period. It is hoped that the plan will benefit forward planning for both time and financial purposes and will be developed through the input of current Councillors and in consultation with Parishioners. Highways and Drainage:

The Parish Council have successfully accessed grant funding from Herefordshire Council to support our Lengthsman's work on our C and U roads. £4842 has been awarded and a number of jobs have been identified and prioritised and all high priority drainage works have now been carried out: two in Sollershope and two in Yatton. We shall continue to work with the Lengthsman to address the remaining issues within the parameters of the remaining budget.

Footpaths:

The Lengthsman spent some time early in the Autumn cutting back around the entrances to the parish footpaths. With a limited budget and an extensive network of footpaths, the Parish Council rely on landowners to maintain the length of footpaths and stiles or gates that cross their land.

Volunteers:

However, we are keen to develop a team of volunteers to help support community action in the parishes and propose that the first project will focus on Footpaths. This may be to walk the footpaths in order to identify any issues, or maybe join a working party to do some hands-on work to help keep them tidy and accessible. If you might be interested in joining the team, we'd love to hear from you.

Bridge at St. Michael's Church, Sollershope:

We would like to remind you to take care if you are planning to use the bridge at St. Michael's Church in Sollershope. Herefordshire Council have confirmed they will be replacing the bridge because of its condition but currently have no indication of timescale. If they can't do it quickly, they may close it because of safety concerns throughout the winter.

Broadband Connectivity:

This has been raised as a topic of concern this year so in July we invited Herefordshire Council's Fastershire and Engagement Officer to the Parish Council meeting to talk about the current situation, planned improvements and actions residents can take to improve their connectivity. The digital changeover from analogue to digital lines (PSTN switch off) anticipated over the next few years will require properties to have a fast and reliable broadband service for both telephone and broadband. - Your total household income is under £31,000 per year
- You live in an inefficient property, with an Energy Performance Certificate of D, E, F or G

We are looking for your feedback on a number of consultations:

Coronation Event Raffle Money:

The sale of raffle tickets at the Coronation event in May raised £147.00 and the Parish Council would like to ask for your suggestions on how it should be used. The options are:

Purchase a bench to commemorate the coronation to be sited on U70009 Barrell Hill Purchase an iron beacon to commemorate the coronation to be sited at a suitable location within the parishes

Donate the funds to Brockhampton Cricket Club

Donate the funds towards the purchase of a defibrillator to be sited at Wilmot House Donate the funds towards the renovation of the tennis courts at Brockhampton Village Hall

Parish Veterans:

The Parish Council has been asked to consider a request for financial support towards a Veterans Outreach Service in Ross on Wye.

To assist with this, it would be helpful to understand whether any residents of How Caple, Sollershope or Yatton would qualify for veteran support and would find such a service useful. Therefore, I'd like to ask that you get in touch if either you or any local veterans you know would benefit from the service.

SmartWater:

Smartwater is an initiative promoted by West Mercia Police to reduce burglaries. To become a Smartwater Village, 80% of residents must agree to take part. Smartwater Kits cost £8.00 per unit; the PCC will subsidise 25% but the Parish Council would need to pay the remaining 75%.

The 'We Don't Buy Crime' Team are available to give a parish talk to explain how the system works so if would like us to explore this further, please get in touch.

Draft Budget 2024/25:

The draft budget for 2024/25 has been prepared by the Finance Working Group following a review of accounts for the current year, forecasted to reflect a year end position. The budget is now in the consultation phase and we would like to ask for your feedback. Please email any comments or questions to the Clerk. It is proposed to raise the precept this year to budget for increasing costs and to protect the reserves that Parish Councils are obliged to hold. This would equate to an increase of approximately £8.82 per Band D equivalent property per year.

Garden Waste Survey:

Herefordshire Council are seeking feedback on the future collection of garden waste. Open until the 19th January, they are looking to gauge the level of potential interest in a paid for subscription-based, fortnightly, collection service to be introduced from April 2025. Subscribing properties would be provided with a 240-litre brown bin, 18 annual collections. The garden waste collected would be composted. The annual subscription fee is anticipated to be £55.
