Dear Parish Councillors and Residents, welcome to this edition of my ward report I hope you find it interesting and there is a 'useful information' section at the end. This report is prepared from information from Herefordshire Council and other councillor sources so that I may provide a comprehensive review of the County activities.

Unfortunately the spring/early summer sunshine has turned back to rain and although the forecast for the week ahead looks to be greatly improving nothing is guaranteed so please do be careful when travelling as heavy showers often lead to slippery road surfaces. Excess rain also leads to muddy fields and with farmers needing to enter and exit fields at the moment it is not uncommon to see mud on the roads. The vast majority of farmers are very diligent and clear up any mud very quickly but where you do spot a problem please let me or the locality steward know so the matter may be appropriately dealt with.

The recent warm and wet weather has continued to lead to surge growth on the verges. This can cause visibility / safety issues at junctions and on narrow roads. The delay in cutting potentially dangerous junctions has been raised with Herefordshire Council / Balfour Beatty and if you are aware of any that haven't yet been cut then please do let me know. Equally Balfour Beatty have started the normal verge cutting programme. I remind you, in this newsletter that any verge areas requiring to be extended or reduced require to be notified to BBLP. We are operating to the practices contained within the principles of community wildflower planting, (Verging on Wild | Herefordshire Wildlife Trust (herefordshirewt.org).

Results of General election - Herefordshire

North Herefordshire / Hereford and South Herefordshire constituencies declared

Ellie Chowns (Green Party) gain North Herefordshire with 21,736 votes.

Jesse Norman (Conservative Party) held Hereford and South Herefordshire with 14,871 votes.

The total number of ballot papers verified for North Herefordshire was 50,507. The overall turnout for North Herefordshire was 69.4%.

The total number of ballot papers verified for Hereford and South Herefordshire was 45,726. The overall turnout for Hereford and South Herefordshire was 63.3%.

Turnout % = ballot paper issued, divided by electorate, multiplied by 100.

Armed Forces Week

Last week was Armed Forces week and sadly many local communities no longer marked



this opportunity to recognise the important contribution our military forces have and to continue to have on giving us the peace and prosperity we take so much for granted. Herefordshire has long history with the military with over 2,500 active military personnel in the County today and their 1100 children educated in our schools.

We have nearly 10,000 veterans living in the county of which half are under the age of 65. They play and important contribution to our local economy providing enterprise and employment in defence and security

sectors. There is also a great need to support veterans and their families who enter into the very different world of civilian life provided by many charities and a Veterans centre in Hereford which with the recent backing of a lottery grant will be opening 5 days a week.

Council News

Childrens' Services

The progress of the priority service of the council – children's care remains being addressed. It is a large task to improve the outcomes but steady improvement is being made with indications we are moving to a position of similar authorities.

There are 390 children in local authority care with:

- 195 having protection plans, and
- During 2023/24 early help family support was given to 938 children and their families.
- Of the children in care approximately

- o 20% were 4 years and under;
- o 48% were 5-14 years;
- 9% were 14-16 years and;
- o 23% were16-18

Individuals can remain within the system till 21 years and older. Nine children were adopted and 18 are awaiting adoption.

Budgets are tightly monitored with reduction in high costs of out of county placements and transfer of less agency to move to full time employees being priority.

Our fostering team are on the lookout for new foster carers and they have a fantastic referral scheme which promises £500 to anyone who recommends someone who is then successfully recruited as a foster carer. Fostering is such a rewarding and vital role and if you know of someone who would be a perfect candidate please let me or Childrens' Services know.

A new Corporate Director of Children and Young People has joined Herefordshire Council. Tina Russell joined from Monday 1st July. Tina will lead on the children's services improvement programme and establishing a strong leadership team for the directorate.

Hereford Football Club – lease extended and work being undertaken



Hereford FC have signed a deal to remain at Edgar Street stadium until 2070. The club said the agreement with Herefordshire Council would secure its long term future. The council is also working with Hereford FC to look at the redevelopment of the

Blackfriars End. Last month saw the demolition of the old western end stand of Hereford football club making way for a new development as part of the council's extended partnership with the club.

Herefordshire's unprecedented Luston Wetland project has been acknowledged with a Local Government Chronicle (LGC) award for Environmental Services. High levels of Phosphate have long been known to damage our rivers including the Wye and Lugg. By 2019 Natural England advised Herefordshire Council that the levels of phosphate in the Lugg sub catchment meant that in order to protect the river, any new housing development must fully offset its

Herefordshire Council responded to this with a unique global first in developing the Luston Wetland to capture and remove phosphate, helping to improve the wellbeing of our rivers and creating credits that could be used for new homes. The scheme ensures that more phosphate is removed from the river system than is returned to it through any form of development and provides a boost to local biodiversity and wildlife, helping to safeguard our natural environment as a county.

Our Luston Wetlands project has been recognised once again, this time by the Royal Town Planning Institute West Midlands Awards for Planning Excellence. Congratulations again to our natural environment team for all their hard work – it's great to see this innovative project getting the attention it deserves. As part of the River Severn Partnership, we received the Innovation of Partnerships award at the Municipal Journal (MJ) achievement awards. The River Severn Partnership has had a transformative effect, attracting funding for improvement projects that are having a positive impact on the health of the river and the environment surrounding it.

Potholes and Highways defects



Sadly I know there are a lot of highways still requiring attention. Potholes are reported by public, locality stewards, and parish councils and after review are categorised and repairs are undertaken with the required urgency of the categorisation, within the time limits. However, budgets do play an important role in pothole repairs.

There are programmes of work being carried out relating to highways resurfacing and surface dressing. The areas requiring attention are arrived at following regular inspections by Locality Stewards and the results of their investigation are

recorded and a programme of repairs relating to their categorisation is programmed to be carried out.

There is not only a problem with highway surfaces but also some defects to the highway caused due to drainage issues. These require to be addressed at the same time, if there are adding to the problem. This will work towards addressing the defects in the highway.

The summer months do provide a respite on the deterioration of the highways and I am keen to get our roads in a good repair before winter returns.

Community Flood Signage Scheme



On behalf of Herefordshire Council, Balfour Beatty Living Places has established the county's first Community Flood Signage Scheme in Orleton. The scheme enables trained Flood Warden Volunteers to close a small stretch of highway during a flood event to prevent vehicles driving though flood water, preventing accidents, breakdowns and damage to property caused by bow waves.

The scheme has taken a lead from Nottinghamshire County Council who already run a successful Community Flood Signage Scheme. Initially being run as a trial scheme, it is hoped that the model can be rolled out to other communities within Herefordshire.

Your cat must be microchipped and registered by the time they're 20 weeks old. This includes cats that usually only stay indoors.

Report fly tippers

If you spot someone fly-tipping

- Make a note of any vehicle used, including model, colour and registration number. If it is safe to do so without
 being seen, take a photograph or video of the activity
- Note the fly tippers' clothes, and distinguishing features. If you can hear the fly tippers, take note of anything which was said along with the speakers' accents
- Make a note of what they dumped, the location, weather conditions and how far away you were at the time;
- You may report fly tipping on an app on the website and available for download.
