Dear Residents

My apologies but there was no ward report in August, but this month is a very slow month with officers on leave. While we have enjoyed our sunny weather this summer we still need to be preparing for future times, and it has just started to rain again – so I suppose autumn is coming early but where did the summer go?

Herefordshire council's cabinet took the decision to begin the procurement for the contractor to build the first phase of a resultant bypass for the city from the A49 to A465.

This was originally programmed in 2018 backed with the then with then planning permission gained and land purchased and government's financial support. However, the previous administration with their cancellation in 2022, sent the government funding back and sold back the acquired land. Now, working with an identified contractor design can be finalised, land rebought and work able to begin in late 2026; to provide this vital first stage. Once fully realised, the completed western bypass could unlock acres of employment land and deliver thousands of new homes and related local infrastructure, while at the same time reducing traffic volume and improving air quality in the city. Given the government's demand for over 27,260 new homes to be built in Herefordshire over the next 20 years (we currently have 82,000 homes) delay in tackling infrastructure will cause huge impacts on our county.

Call for Sites - repeat.

Following an update to the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF)) National Planning Policy Framework - GOV.UK. by the UK Government, the new standard method for calculating growth requirements has set a 20-year housing requirement for Herefordshire of 27,260 dwellings. Despite Herefordshire Council's objections the Government is persisting with its increased housing target on our County of 27,260 new dwellings in the next 20 years. A rate on average of over 1,350 per year which we have never ever achieved in the County, where we currently have 82,000 homes for our population of c. 190,000 people. We have made the case of lack of transport and public services infrastructure or capacity, and where the people are coming from with the skills to build all these properties.

Long Year of Delivery



The start of this month marks the beginning of Herefordshire Council's "long year of delivery" — an ambitious 18-month programme of multi-million-pound investment designed to bring lasting benefits to families, businesses and communities across the county — with the ground-breaking of the Hereford Transport Hub. The £11 million Hub will integrate key travel connections, making it easier to move around by train, bus, car, bike, taxi, or on foot. This forms part of a wider Local Transport

Plan shaped by public input, with strong support for better bus services, active travel options, and the Bypass. The Hub will enhance the area around the station, providing new bus stands and layovers, taxi and car parking areas (including commuter and short-term parking), indoor welfare facilities for passengers, and covered cycle facilities with lockers.

The official start of the works as I know the hub has been a long-term ambition going back many years, starting with the Hereford City Centre Transport Plan (HCCTP) project back in 2012. The design of the hub kicked off in 2022 when consultants were appointed, and since then we've seen strong backing from Members leading us to where we are today. It truly has been a whole-of-council achievement, but I would especially like to thank Cllr Price for his leading role in the Council on this important project, and Scott Tompkins and his team for driving it through.



Gullies

Gullies are individually marked on the map with latitudes and longitudes being displayed along with a site code, which is used to identify the length of road where the asset is located.

Reporting gullies that need attention:

Report issues with the highway drainage network through the Council's online reporting system at https://www.herefordshire.gov.uk/roads-1/report-problems-road.

Issues reported are investigated by the relevant Locality Steward, who assesses the report against the Highway Maintenance Plan in order to determine the level of intervention required. Where necessary a job for a reactive cleanse is then raised and passed to a crew to attend.

If you spot someone fly-tipping

- Make a note of any vehicle used, including model, colour and registration number. If it
 is safe to do so without being seen, take a photograph or video of the activity.
- Note the fly tippers' clothes, and distinguishing features. If you can hear the fly tippers, take note of anything which was said along with the speakers' accents.
- Make a note of what they dumped, the location, weather conditions and how far away
 you were at the time.
- You may report fly tipping on an app on the website and available for download.
